Something to learn

(First video: What's wrong with this world?)
Express yourself
E.g. "What makes us so self-absorbed?"
 You might be a Christian, but you too, by nature, will hate God and your neighbour (= love
yourself above all others)
You can use words
 Self-absorbed became self-interest and then: "It's more than self-interest, it's self-government"
(Second video: It's all about living a good life)
Don't tell your story
 The topic of Jesus' cross came up early
- But it wasn't until the 'chuck himself in front of a bus to save a kid's life' that the right moment
had come for the story.
Handling common questions
In formulating a response to a question, consider:
Does it?
Is it truthful? Is it loving?
Does it?
Lead back to: is Christ who He says He is?
Does it?
Don't just answer, ask if there's more.
Is it?
Try to cast your response in a way that is acceptable to the other, without doing injustice to the Gospel.
